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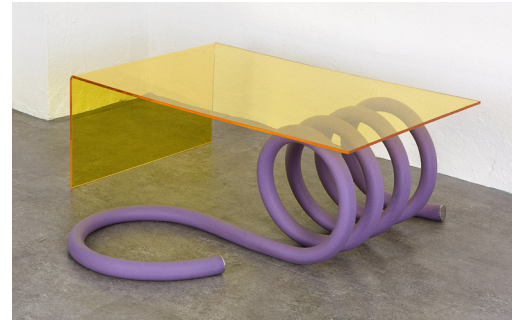
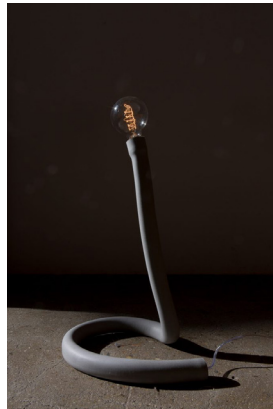
With her Mono furniture line, designer Jeong Greem has taken the concept of a seating object and given it a whole new look.

Less is more. The small and simple law that despite the passing of time is always winning. Designer Jeong Greem applied this rule to her latest furniture collection, Mono, made with a single object. It is a silicone foam tube that is malleated, wrapped around itself and twisted until it takes on a shape that allows you to sit on it.

The collection is composed of different pieces including chairs, tables, coat racks, lamps, each formed by a colored tube that, in cases where you want a “do not know that” more can also be covered with velvet.

The peculiarity of Jeong Greem’s creations is that they totally break down the concept of chair, becoming almost sculptures or installations. In fact, if you saw one in a living room, there would be some doubt.
